Must Do's Clinical Procedures

Students should have the opportunity to participate in the following: (Students are encouraged to seek out these experiences.)

- Acid base and *l* or ABG gas interpretation
- CAM (Confusion Assessment Method) score for delirium
 - Chest X-ray interpretation
- Cognitive assessment (e.g. MMSE, MoCA)
- Complete neurological exam (including cranial nerves)
- EKG interpretation
- Extrapyramidal side effects physical exam
 - Glucometer interpretation

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Must See's Patient Encounters

It is expected that the student will likely encounter the following: (Students are encouraged to seek out these experiences.)

- Abnormal CBC
- Abnormal Pathology with clinical correlation (eg cytology, biopsy)
- Acute dyspnea
- Ascites / liver failure / elevated liver enzymes
- Cellulitis
- Cutaneous manifestation of systemic disease
- O Delirium / confusion
- O Dementia
- Diabetic complications (eg DKA)
- O Dysphagia
- Electrolyte abnormality
- Infections (including choice of antimicrobials)
- Malignancy
- Palliative care (including end of life care)
- Renal disease (eg AKI, CKD)
- Skin lesion, including cancer
- Venous thromboembolic disease
